From the Pastor: God's Word. Our Gibraltar

In Memorial Estates Cemetery near Chicago, one can see a massive stone Bible weighing 37 tonsthought to be the largest in the world. While such a monument is impressive, it cannot begin to represent the true strength of the Word of God.

The Word of God, written by the inspired prophets and apostles, is central to the Reformation. Martin Luther has us sing, "A Mighty Fortress is our God" because He has given us His might in which we take refuge. In defiance of all enemies of the pure Gospel, this Word, "they still shall let remain" for the simple reason that they cannot destroy it.

The Word of God proclaims the Valiant one, Jesus Christ, the Sabaoth Lord and sole Savior. *Sola Scriptura-* "Scripture Alone"- is written in large letters on Reformation banners, for it testifies to Christ alone as the Savior from Sin. Jesus stood firmly on the "it is written" of the Holy Scripture because it could not be broken.

As the sole source of Christian doctrine, Holy Scripture can and does teach authoritatively the other two great principles of the Reformation: "Grace Alone" and "Faith Alone."

The apostle Paul teaches very clearly, "For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast." (Ephesians 2:8-9) Now all glory belongs to God. (taken from: Each Day with Jesus. CPH 1999)





one of Martin Luther's earliest and most influential supporters, had the VDMA symbol sewn into the right sleeve of the official garments worn at his court. The symbol also appeared on banners, flags, swords, and uniforms, representing the unity of the Lutheran laity in standing firm in their faith.



QUESTION: On what should we base our assurance of salvation? I know the Word and the promises of the Gospel are our rock, but how do we distinguish between real faith and mere intellectual assent?

I ask this because many evangelicals make me nervous when they say that if one has doubts about one's salvation, one is probably not saved because the Holy Spirit is supposed to provide inner assurance. (I guess this ties in to the whole Pietist problem.)

But in the face of emotional ups and downs, moral failings, intellectual doubts, and confusion over doctrine, how can one know if one truly has faith in Christ?

ANSWER: Lutherans believe that faith is created and strengthened not by looking inside of one's self (to one's own faith and/or doubts) but by looking outside of one's self (to God's Word and promises in Christ).

Therefore, assurance of salvation is to be sought by looking to God's Word and promises in Christ (which create and strengthen the faith through which one is saved), not by looking inward at the strength or weakness of one's own faith (which creates either pride and false assurance or doubt and lack of assurance).

Anxiety regarding doubts, strength of faith and certainty of salvation are signs of faith (however weak it may be), not signs of unbelief, since the unbeliever has no concern or anxiety about doubts, faith or salvation.

If you would like to study this issue further, I would recommend Martin Chemnitz's book on *Justification*, available from Concordia Publishing House (800-325-3040, stock no. 15-2186).


Providence and Pastries

Church Council

As you are probably aware Zion Lutheran Church in Chanute has requested a meeting with a committee from St. Peter's to discuss a possible partnership. The meeting is scheduled for **October 13th** with President Panzer mediating. Any final decision concerning a partnership would be made by the Voters' Assembly of the church. If you want to be part of the decision you need to be a voting member.

Per the By-Laws of the church, a voting member is: "Any eligible person (a communicant member age 18 or older) desiring voting membership in this governing body shall request said membership of the President during a regular Voters' Meeting. The governing body shall welcome such application. The applicant shall sign the Constitution and be given a copy thereof. The applicant shall then have the right to vote at the next regular meeting."

Notice that a person cannot ask for membership at their first meeting and also vote at that meeting. They cannot vote until their second meeting. The next scheduled voters' meeting is **October 12.** No decision about a partnership will be made at that meeting. However, if you are not a voting member you need to attend that meeting and become a voting member to be able to vote at subsequent meetings when a decision may be made.
